COUNTRY REPORT

ROMANIA

1. Continue the night controls of the Minister of Health at the health units throughout the country.
2. An Order of the Minister of Health was issued for the amendment of those working at the emergency reception units for the delayed taking of patients who come to the hospital for medical and / or surgical emergencies. In this way, the personnel employed in the emergency units are made responsible for the large flow of patients to these units, ignoring the objective causes - underfunding of the ambulatory system and of the primary medicine, weak equipping of the offices of primary medicine and ambulatory with medical equipment, the imperfection of the legislation in the sanitary field and many others.
3. The campaign for presidential elections has recently begun. This affects the social dialogue and the highlighting of the problems of the health system, because through the Romanian legislation the president has no direct prerogatives for influencing the specific problems of the health system.
4. The government crisis continues because of the conflict between the Government (from the left) and the President of Romania (the representative of the liberal movement). This distracts public attention from social issues.
5. The decision of the Minister of Health to suspend for six months the parallel export of drugs creates stupor at European level. This is because many of the drugs on this list have never been exported, and

the causes for which they are not on the Romanian market could be quite different.

6. Continue negotiating the collective labor contract at national level. It must be said that the Romanian legislation stipulates the obligation to start the negotiations, but does not provide the obligation to finish them. Also, the legislation does not provide sanctions for delaying these negotiations.
